**BOARD MINUTES- COL (Ret) Karen Coccio**

**LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS – COL (Ret) JIM PAULS**

**At the FEDERAL LEVEL:**

- **“Wounded Veteran Tax”:** This legislative effort which has been going on since 2020 would allow approximately 54,000 “medically-retired” Veterans with less than 20 years of Active Duty to receive both their full retirement pay and VA “Disability Compensation!” Sound familiar? The major delay in getting it passed is due to its projected cost. For instance, Sen Ron Johnson (R-WI) argues that the “original” estimate of \$9.7B is actually \$70B now! MOAA states that Johnson’s estimate of the total estimated cost is wrong because it includes ALL military *medical* retirees while the proposal would only apply to “medical retirees who are eligible for *Combat Related Special Compensation* “and would cost approximately \$11B over TEN years! It’s my personal opinion that enacting this Legislative effort is long overdue and is most worthy of our support!
- **“Love Lives On Act of 2025”:** When a Military member dies, the financial benefits their surviving family members expect to receive are really only *conditional* because the Surviving Spouse “may not remarry before age 55” without losing significant financial benefits! This legislative initiative would end what has become known as the “remarriage penalty!”
- **Military Treatment Facility (MTF) Billet Cuts:** The National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) currently under consideration extends “halts” to medical billet cuts for 10 years and extends notification requirements for any MTF restructuring plans to include an endorsement from the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Surgeon General!

MOAA's experts in Washington are constantly reviewing and assessing legislation that may impact the earned pay, benefits, and support programs of the uniformed services and veteran communities. The organization's endorsement process is deliberative; MOAA will not support or oppose any legislation without a thorough review of its potential effects, positive or negative. **At the STATE LEVEL:**

- **“Unscrupulous” VA Claims Representatives:** As publicized in an “E-Mail Alert” message we sent out on March 27<sup>th</sup>, the MOAA Virginia Council of Chapters (VCOA) urged all MOAA Chapters in Virginia to communicate with the Governor’s office to express strong opposition to legislative proposals (SB 315 and HB 398) which would allow “non-certified” and, in some cases, “unscrupulous” organizations from

performing as “VA Claims representatives.” These Bills will become law if the Governor either approves the Bills OR does nothing **NLT April 13<sup>th</sup>**! All members are urged to contact the Governor’s office urging her to VETO the legislative proposals ASAP by either calling the “Governor’s Comment Line” at (804) 786-2211 or by using the online “Contact Form”: <https://www.governor.virginia.gov/contact/>

- **Virginia Military Survivors and Dependents Education Program (VMSDEP):** This program which was established in 1930 to provide educational assistance to surviving dependents of service members and disabled veterans is undergoing considerable attention. Program costs for tuition waivers and stipends have increased significantly over the years and, as a result, there is considerable disagreement in the Virginia General Assembly about its future. The program is currently funded through June 30, 2026. As of this date, the program is not funded after that date; however, a special session of the General Assembly is scheduled in April to address funding for the program in order to keep it running for at least the next two years!
- **State Income Exemptions for USPHS & NOAA Commissioned Corps Retirees:** Proposed legislation would have expanded those eligible for exemptions for retired Military members to include approximately 358 Virginia residents from these two groups. The proposal was rejected!

### April Special Election

*HJ4 – Redistricting Referendum* | Grants the state legislator the ability to TEMPORARILY adopt new congressional maps. Virginia will go back to the nonpartisan districting commissions congressional map with the 2030 census results. You will be able to vote on this bill and the new map on April 21st.

**ROTC/JROTC -LTC (Ret) TOM SWANSON**

**CHANGES THAT IMPROVE THE JROTC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

As you know, annually VIPMOAA presents awards and scholarships to 3 local college ROTC programs and up to 11 local high school JROTC programs. Your contributions to the VIPMOAA community service and charitable donations account directly support these awards and scholarships. 100% of your money goes to this effort.

At the Feb VIPMOAA BoD meeting a change to the JROTC scholarship program was presented and approved. Going forward we have reduced the number of Senior Cadet scholarships to 6 and increased the amounts from \$500 to \$1000. The awards will now be competitive versus solely selected by the senior JROTC instructor. Application will be online via the VIPMOAA web site, and the applications will be judged by a VIPMOAA selection committee. Criteria include; JROTC participation, academic performance, financial need, and most importantly a short explanation of how the award will impact the student's academic or career plans.

VIPMOAA also desires to expand our awards to more non-traditional forms of post-secondary education such as trade schools, apprenticeships, or certificate awarding programs. We will also continue, at the high school level, to award an achievement certificate, medal, and a \$50 gift card to an outstanding and deserving Junior Year cadet. At the college ROTC level, we will continue to award the MOAA Medal, certificate, and a \$500 stipend to an outstanding Junior Year cadet. Thank you for your continued support of this program and the JROTC/ROTC cadets.

The 250th anniversary of the American Revolution will feature events honoring veterans, promoting national pride, and encouraging youth to become future civic and military leaders. Historically, young people have contributed to military efforts as drummer boys and civilians supporting independence.

The Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) and its Virginia Peninsula Chapter (VIPMOAA) have a long history of supporting military officers and promoting

The organization encourages camaraderie among branches, and since 1973, has welcomed women into college ROTC and high school JROTC programs. The Space Force established its first unit in 2019. There are now over 3,200 JROTC units nationwide managed by six branches of the U.S. uniformed services, each organized to resemble its parent branch.

The MOAA 5-Star Level Of Excellence Award winning Virginia Peninsula Chapter of the Military Officers Association of America (VIPMOAA) encompasses Fort Eustis, Langley Air Force Base, Naval Weapons Station Yorktown, Yorktown Coast Guard Station and the surrounding towns and counties. Most members live in Williamsburg, Yorktown, Newport News and Hampton. Historic Jamestown Fort and Fort Monroe are also located in VIPMOAA's area.

The chapter promotes legislation benefiting the military community, preserves traditions, fosters camaraderie, supports veterans and spouses, and mentors' youth for civilian and military leadership. VIPMOAA members and families participate in various activities, legislative efforts, support for JROTC/ROTC, honor flights, surviving spouses, and other beneficiaries.

The program emphasizes military discipline and science; cadets often take part in various extracurricular activities like drill teams, color guards, marksmanship competitions, and leadership events, all intended to build physical fitness and develop leadership abilities.

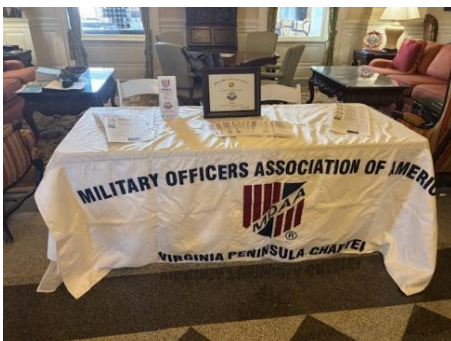




