Americans remember September 11th by honoring the "911 call" answered by veterans, public safety professionals, and citizens through a lasting commitment to "Never Stop Serving." The events of 9/11 shaped America's future, influencing national security, civil

#### **Protect Servicemember Pay During Any Future Shutdown**

The Shutdown Fairness Act (S. 3168 / H.R. 7137) ensures members of the armed services, to include the reserve component, receive their pay during any future lapse in appropriations. As written, the bill does not explicitly include members of the U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps or the NOAA Commissioned Corps, who should be added before the bill moves to a vote.

## ROTC/JROTC -LTC (Ret) TOM SWANSON

With Williamsburg-James City County (WJCC) Schools joining this school year, VIPMOAA will support 18 or more high school's programs with scholarship opportunities. Tom Swanson and his team will promote JROTC programs, VIPMOAA scholarships, and the new electronic application process. ## VIPMOAA helps bring Army JROTC to WJCC Schools



Williamsburg-James City County (WJCC) Schools and the community had long sought a local JROTC program. WJCC applied for a Coast Guard unit in January 2023, the division was placed on a waitlist. In its 2024–25 Annual Report, the Career Ready Advisory Committee urged the school board to keep pursuing a cadet program, citing JROTC's role in developing leadership, fitness, and college and career readiness.

Superintendent Daniel Keever said JROTC based at Jamestown High School, will include job shadowing, community service, and flag-presentation opportunities, noting strong early interest in WJCC's first JROTC

program. "It is a programmatic opportunity that this area has long sought," he said.

On April 17, 2026, WJCC announced that U.S. Army Cadet Command had approved an Army JROTC program to begin in fall 2026. The program will use military- and science-based lessons to develop critical thinking, leadership, and life skills. Keever said it will include job shadowing, community service, and flag-presentation opportunities, noting strong early interest in WJCC's first JROTC program. "It is a programmatic opportunity that this area has long sought," he said. Based at Jamestown High School, the program will be open to all WJCC high school students, with transportation planned from other division schools.

Harry Moser of the Reshoring Initiative says manufacturing growth depends on a stronger skilled workforce. JROTC supports that goal by building discipline, fitness, leadership, civic responsibility, and readiness for citizenship or service through science-based instruction and hands-on activities.

VIPMOAA provides annual awards and scholarships to three local college ROTC programs and regional high school JROTC programs, funded entirely by donations to its community service and charitable account. The board approved a revised JROTC scholarship program offering six competitive \$1,000 Senior Cadet scholarships, replacing the previous \$500 instructor-selected awards. Students will apply through the VIPMOAA website, and a selection committee will evaluate applications based on JROTC participation, academics, financial need, and how the award supports each student's academic or career goals.

VIPMOAA also aims to support trade schools, apprenticeships, and certificate programs. It will continue recognizing high school junior cadets with an achievement certificate, medal, and \$50 gift card, and college ROTC junior cadets with the MOAA Medal, certificate, and \$500 stipend.

William & Mary's ROTC unit, the Revolutionary Guard Battalion, prepares students for military and civilian leadership. Scholarships are available, and partnerships with Christopher Newport and Hampton universities support Army, Navy, and Marine Corps officer preparation.

## ***IMPORTANT DATES IN US MILITARY HISTORY FOR SEPTEMBER***

**3 September 1783 - The Revolutionary War** - Great Britain formally recognized the independence of the United States in the Treaty of Paris.

**20 September 1861- The Civil War** - Lexington, Missouri falls to Confederate forces under Sterling Price.

**10 September 1813 – The War of 1812 -**

Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry led an American battle, the Battle of Lake Erie, in a victory over the British fleet on Lake Erie. This success secured control of the lake, for the recapture of Detroit, and boosted U.S. morale.

**19 September 1944 – World War II** - The Battle of Hürtgen Forest started. It was a series of battles between American and German forces on the Western Front and it was the second longest single battle the U.S. Army has ever fought after the three-month-long Battle of Bataan.<sup>[5]</sup>

**15 September 1950 – The Korean War** - The United Nations forces, led by the United States, launch a counter-offensive with the landing of forces at Inchon.

**16 September 2006 - Operation Mountain Fury** - a NATO/US-led operation was a follow-up operation to Operation Medusa, to clear Taliban insurgents from the eastern provinces of Afghanistan.
